There has been one case of Needle Cast Disease found in Sedley. What is needle cast disease, you ask?

Needle cast diseases cause spruce trees to “cast off” their older needles and keep only the young needles at the tips of the branches. The tree becomes unattractive and may look as though it is dying, but don’t despair. Rhizosphaera and Stigmina, the two most common needle cast diseases of spruce trees, are treatable. You can have your tree looking lush and beautiful again within a few years by following a program of needle cast treatment.

If you think you have this fungus, please contact the Village Office and we will provide treatment options.

We’d like to thank everyone who responded to our question regarding dust control. The intent was to gauge interest of rate payers in order to decide if we would proceed. We had over 60 responses, most of which were ‘no thanks’. One block did decide to pool funds and have the dust control applied. We feel this is a good test to see if this is something which may work in the future.

We’ve noticed water usage is creeping higher as we move into warmer weather. We are asking you to practice good water conservation while it’s so dry. Don’t water your garden in the heat of the day - best time to water is before 8 AM and after 7 PM. If we continue to experience dry conditions we will implement Odd/Even again this year. If your house number is even - water on even days (2, 4, 6, etc.); if your house number is odd - water on odd days (1, 3, 5, etc.). **YOU WILL BE ADVISED SHOULD ODD/EVEN WATERING GO INTO AFFECT – AS OF THE WRITING OF THIS NEWSLETTER, IT WOULD BE APPRECIATED, BUT NOT REQUIRED.**

Don’t forget our Recycling contest is still on-going! You will hear more about it in the coming weeks!! Let’s reduce the waste going to our landfill!
