
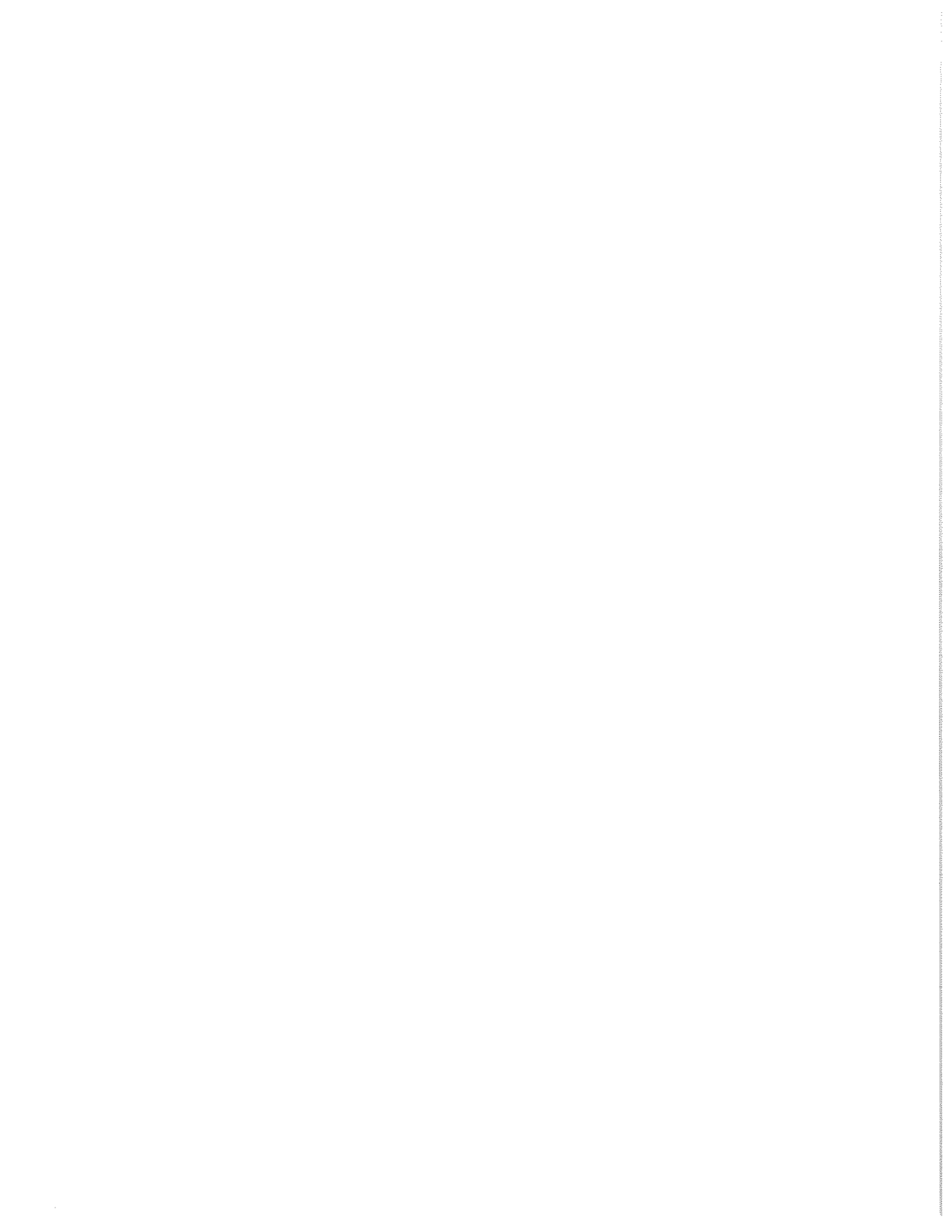

THE SEDLEY VEHICLE PARKING AND STORAGE ON RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY BYLAW

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The Council of the Village of Sedley in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

PART 1 – INTRODUCTORY PROVISIONS

1) Short title

The bylaw may be cited as the Village of Sedley Parking Bylaw.

PART 2 – DEFINITIONS & INTERPRETATION

2) Whenever in this bylaw, the following words or terms are used, they shall, unless the text otherwise provides, be held to have the following meanings:

- a) "Assistant Administrator" is defined as the Assistant Administrator of the Village of Sedley
- b) "Authorized person" is defined as per section 371(1)(a) of *The Municipalities Act*
- c) "CAO" is defined as the Chief Administrative Officer of the Village of Sedley
- d) "Driveway" is defined as a private right-of-way abutting and providing access for vehicles from a street, boulevard, curb, or sidewalk to a carport, garage or hard surface parking pad located on the same lot
- e) "Hard surface" means a durable hard surface of asphalt, concrete, slag, brick or other similar material excluding dirt, or grass
- f) "Improved property" is defined as a property which according to its assessment is not vacant or land only
- g) "Owner" is defined as per section 371(b) of *The Municipalities Act*
- h) "Recreational vehicle" means, except in Part 4, a vehicle designed for camping and other recreational purposes. It includes, but is not limited to, a motorhome, a truck on which a camper has been installed, a camping or travel trailer, and any trailer carrying recreational equipment such as boat, or other watercraft, a snowmobile, all-terrain vehicle or other off-road vehicle

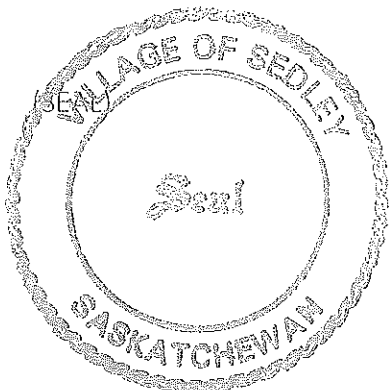
- i) "Traffic control device" means a sign, marking or device placed or erected by or on behalf of the Village for the purpose of regulating parking or regulating, warning or guiding traffic
- j) "Trailer" means a vehicle designed for carrying goods or persons and for being towed by a motor vehicle
- k) "Unauthorized person" is defined as per 37(1)(c) of *The Municipalities Act*
- l) "Vacant property" is defined as having no accessory buildings such as house, garage, or shed
- m) "Vehicle" means a vehicle within the meaning of *The Highways Transportation Act 1997*
- n) "Village" is defined as Village of Sedley


PART 3 - GENERAL



- 3) No person shall suffer, cause or permit all or part of any vehicle to be kept on any land between the front of a residential building and a street, and for a corner lot, the side of a residential building and a street, except where the entire vehicle is located on and over a hard surface driveway or parking pad.
- 4) No person shall allow more than six (6) vehicles to be parked on property within Village limits.
- 5) No person shall allow more than three (3) recreational vehicles to be parked on property within Village limits.

PART 4 - PENALTY

- 6) If this bylaw is contravened the Village may, by written order, require the owner or occupant to remove vehicles, failing which the Village may take whatever actions or measures are necessary to remedy a contravention of the bylaw, including removal of vehicles and add to the tax roll any unpaid expenses and costs incurred by the Village for removing said vehicles.
- 7) This Bylaw comes into force on the day of its final passing.
